


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OUR MISSION





This year marked a decade of hosting Carols of Carlsbad, an annual showcase of elementary, middle, and high school students in choir, band, and orchestra. It's one way we get to thank our community for its investment in music education.

STEAM EDUCATIONBUILDS OUR FUTURE

STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts, and Math) education helps develop student inquiry, dialogue, and critical thinking.

In the 2018-19 school year, our donors and community helped grant more than



to district-wide STEAM education programs.

This helped fully-fund robotics curriculum in 2nd grade, a day of science at every elementary and middle school, and science lab equipment and supplies at both high schools.

2018-19 Welcomed Second Grade Robotics!

When you give a 2nd grade student LEGOs and task them to get a ship to the moon, amazing things occur! In 2018-19, every 2nd grader received in-class instruction for the *FIRST* LEGO League Jr. Robotics program.

Students waited all year for their chance to build with LEGOs and their education was enriched through projects, competitions, and group activities.

Community partner LEGOLAND California® played an instrumental role in bringing this program to fruition. LEGOLAND California® donated a portion of our Foundation's 'Celebrate Carlsbad Day' event proceeds to support 2nd grade robotics. LEGOLAND California® also donated field trip admission tickets to Carlsbad students for hands-on robotics visits to the park.

Community partners Nordson Corporation, Beckman Coulter, Viasat, Leidos, and iMaps also support the *FIRST* robotics programs at every grade level.

"Second grade is the perfect time to start exposing students to robotics, design thinking, and even elementary coding," said Superintendent Dr. Ben Churchill.

"It provides cross-curricular opportunities to work on skills such as language, communication, teamwork, problem solving and more."

BIZ TOWN (grade 5)

In elementary school, all 5th graders prepare for and attend Junior Achievement's BizTown, a mini city where students spend a day working as bankers, salespeople, news reporters, food servers, and more.

BizTown teaches what it's like to manage staff and pay employees while getting a glimpse into what their parents do every day. They also get to see what businesses are based right here in San Diego County.

2 NORDSON'S TECH TIME CHALLENGE (grades 6 - 8)

In middle school, all students participate in the Tech Time Challenge presented by our community partner Nordson Corporation. This program engages students in STEAM by giving them a real-world problem to solve.

For the challenge, students have three weeks to craft creative solutions and present their ideas at a schoolwide assembly. Carlsbad is home to many biotech companies and the Tech Time Challenge places students on a path toward great careers right here.

3 FINANCE PARK (grade 12)

Brand new this year was Junior Achievement's Finance Park. As part of their economics class, 12th-grade students receive real-world training in financial literacy to understand the link between lifestyle, education, and career. Students then visit Finance Park to navigate life in San Diego on a 30-day budget.

Exploring the cost of living and the difference between "wants" and "needs" is an eye-opening experience that helps graduating seniors make smart financial decisions.





SUSTAINING REVENUE

Our Foundation's Kids Care and SOAR programs are onsite at every elementary and middle school and net proceeds cover all operating expenses.

This ensures every single penny from grants and donations goes directly to student programs.







SUMMER PROGRAMS

This year, we turned our summer Kids Care into Summer Adventure! Students enrolled in our full-day program took part in weekly themed adventures that merged education with outdoor play, crafts, and fun.

All proceeds from our summer enrichment programs go back to the Carlsbad **Unified School District for district-wide programs.**




