Since its inception, the foundation has awarded more than \$16 million to Carlsbad public schools, primarily for music, STEAM, and innovation – programs that would not be possible in California's current school funding environment.



ALL GRANTS AWARDED

3D Printers

Grade 7 and 8 at Calavera Hills Middle 3D printers enhance the Project Lead the Way Design and Modeling course and the 3D printing units in science class.

Art Studio Supercharge

Grades 9 – 12

Provides art supplies for art and ceramic classes, enabling teachers to introduce new techniques and projects. Students explore diverse mediums and expand their creative expression.

Agua Hedionda Lagoon Foundation *Grades 3 and 7*

Through field trips to the Agua Hedionda Lagoon Foundation, students develop a deeper understanding about the local environment, conservation, and impact of human activity.

Career Technical Education (CTE) Ambassador Shirts

Grades 9 – 12

Promotional t-shirts for CTE Pathway ambassadors and teachers were purchased to increase awareness for CUSD CTE pathways at school and public events.

Coastal Roots Farm Grades TK. K. and 4

A multi-week unit that concludes with a field trip to Coastal Roots Farm, helping students apply NGS Standard STEAM lessons in a hands-on and immersive, outdoor experience.

FIRST® LEGO® League Robotics

Grades 4-8

An after-school competitive robotics program that challenges students to design, build, and program LEGO®-based robots to solve realistic problems. Participants develop critical teamwork, innovation, and communication skills while embracing core values like discovery, inclusion, and fun.

FIRST LEGO® League Explore Robotics Grade 2

A 12-week, in-class robotics introduction that inspires creativity and teamwork as students explore realistic challenges. Using LEGO® Education robots, students build a model and create a poster to share their innovative ideas.

FIRST® Tech Challenge Robotics

Grades 9 – 12

An after-school competitive robotics program where students design, build, and program robots to compete in dynamic, team-based challenges. FTC emphasizes innovation, collaboration, and problem-solving and encourages students to apply STEM skills to real life.

STEM IN THE 3RD DIMENSION

This year, seventh and eighth graders at Calavera Hills Middle School expanded their skills in cutting-edge technology using three new **3D printers**. These tools boosted handson learning in both Project Lead the Way (PLTW) and 3D printing units in science classes.

Grades 6 – 8 at Calavera Hills Middle Funding provides three science and STEM classrooms with appropriate, flexible furniture for hands-on science labs and activities.

Junior Achievement BizTown

Grade 5

Students engage in a 6-week curriculum culminating in a trip to a simulated town, getting a glimpse into the workforce and career opportunities by selecting a profession, working shifts, writing and cashing checks, and voting for mayor.

Middle School Music Recruitment Grades 5

Band and orchestra students in grades 6-8 visit 5th grade classes to showcase music electives available at the middle school level and to promote these rewarding class options.

Music Teachers & Instruments Grades TK - 5

In partnership with Carlsbad Unified School District, full-time, credentialed music teachers and classroom instruments are funded at every elementary school. Weekly classes explore the fundamentals of music, instruments, cultures, and dances.

Musicals & Show Choir

Grades 6 – 12

Funding elevates opportunities for students to participate in their school's annual musical or choir performances through singing, acting, set design, and theater tech.

Music Coaches, Instruments, and Repairs

Grades 6 – 12

Provides new instruments and repairs to the current inventory as well as small group instrument-specific coaching for students to receive meaningful and timely feedback.

Nobody Knows: Voices (Un)Muted Pilot

Grades 9 – 12

A student-driven, collaborative project within the English and VAPA departments addresses the trials and tribulations of marginalized individuals and gives voice to those communities.

Project Lead the Way

Grades K – 12 at Calavera Hills Elementary, Middle, and Sage Creek High

The program elevates STEM Pathways by offering innovative learning opportunities in biomedical sciences, computer science, and engineering.

Robotics Cart Pilot

Grades K – 5 at Magnolia Elementary

A mobile cart equipped with a variety of robots and materials for grade level teachers, bringing computer science learning into any classroom.

San Diego Children's Discovery **Museum Mobile Lab**

Grade 1

This guided, hands-on workshop with the San Diego Children's Discovery Museum Mobile Lab engages firstgrade students in NGSS-aligned challenges, specifically targeting engineering practices.

Science Days

Grades TK - 8

Students participate in a series of activities throughout the day, led by staff, parent volunteers, community members, and industry partners to engage in hands-on science and career exploration.

Science Lab Supercharge

Grades 6 – 8

This program equips classrooms with high-quality science lab materials, enabling students to engage in handson activities and projects. This grant provides students an immersive and interactive science education.

Science Olympiad

Grades 6 – 12

An after-school, competitive STEM program in which students explore a variety of scientific topics in a mentorled, collaborative forum. This program fosters teamwork, problem solving, and hands-on learning.

Science Lab Teaching Assistants

Grades 9 - 12

Teaching assistants support high school science teachers with lab preparations and in-class science experiments to ensure students are provided exceptional and frequent hands-on labs.

Senior Scholarships

Grade 12

Senior Scholarships award students pursuing university, college, or technical/vocational school who have achieved academic milestones and are passionate about learning.

STEAM Teachers & Supplies

Grades TK - 5

Provides elementary students with a specials rotation for hands-on learning experiences in science, art, technology. design thinking, problem solving, and collaboration.

STEAM Lab Start Up Supplies

Grades TK – 5 at Calavera Hills Elementary Equipment, storage, and supplies for new STEAM Labs on elementary campuses.

Student Leadership Council

Grades 9 – 12

This program empowers high school students with lifelong leadership skills through monthly meetings, philanthropy, and ambassador roles.

GROWING MINDS AT COASTAL ROOTS FARM


All TK, kindergarten and fourth-grade students in the Carlsbad Unified School District visited Coastal Roots Farm this year, thanks to a Carlsbad Educational Foundation grant that fully covered transportation and field trip costs.

> The **hands-on excursion** sparks curiosity, teaches life skills, and nurtures a connection to nature. To prepare, students engaged in STEAM lessons, exploring concepts they would later see come to life on the farm. During the visit, they fed chickens, examined crops, and learned where their food comes from with help from knowledgeable farm staff.

KIDS CARE

The Foundation operates Kids Care, the licensed before-and-after-school care for families at all nine Carlsbad elementary schools. Staff plan engaging activities like STEAM projects, creative arts, and outdoor play for students to have fun in a supportive environment while developing valuable social and academic skills.

Before this year, CUSD hadn't had full-time music teachers at every elementary school for over two decades. With combined support from a \$430,000 grant from the Foundation and state funding through Proposition 28, every elementary school in the district now has a full-time music teacher, offering weekly classes to students in grades TK-5.

The impact has been immediate. CHE Principal **Kimberly Fuentes** has seen firsthand how the addition of a full-time music teacher has transformed her school. "Now our music teachers are part of the team, fully invested in the goals we've set for the school. They also have time to create after-school clubs, like choir or music ensembles, which bring the entire community together."

This year's success is just the beginning. CUSD and CEF plan to continue this funding to foster a lifelong love for the arts.

"We are deeply grateful for the Carlsbad Educational Foundation's ongoing support," said **Ben Churchill**, Superintendent of CUSD. "This funding is helping us provide our students with the rich, well-rounded education they deserve."

Art Studio Supercharge Brushes Up with Technology


This year, the Foundation developed Art Studio **Supercharge**, a program that has transformed secondary art classes by providing additional resources for teachers to introduce new techniques and projects.

Kelly Foulk, a Carlsbad High School art teacher, shared how the program has enhanced her students' creativity: "With the added supplies, we've been able to incorporate technology into our curriculum in a way that supports all types of learners. For instance, using digital drawing tools allows students to experiment and take creative risks they might not have explored because traditional mediums are permanent."

One of the standout resources this year was the image projector used to trace designs. This tool streamlined the sketching process, enabling students to try mural art and advanced painting techniques with more ease and creativity.

Art teachers spend the majority of the district's annual supply budget on expendables - paper, pencil, sharpeners, colored pencils, paint — supplies that are used and are gone every single year. "Having extra funding from CEF to purchase something a little bigger is a huge benefit to our students," said Foulk.

Art Studio Supercharge gives students the opportunity to explore, experiment, and express themselves in ways that were once beyond reach.

Experts Lead a Full Day of Science

It's a day that both students and adult volunteers call the best day ever.

That's how CUSD TK-12 Science Specialist **Ashley Crawford** describes Science Days. "It's a chance to connect, inspire, and ignite a lifelong love for science," she said.

Science Days offers every student in grades TK-8 a hands-on opportunity to explore science and its real-world applications. Volunteers and trained professionals from Thermo Fisher Scientific lead engaging activities that spark curiosity and connect students to potential career paths.

This year, Thermo Fisher taught 4th-grade students about engineering challenges that can result from mass manufacturing. Using a **LEGO®** assembly line, students competed to create the most airplane replicas within a limited amount of time.

Among the standout recipients is **Sofia Tamayo**, a first-generation college student from Carlsbad High School, who received the prestigious \$10,000 Judith Campbell Educational and Community (JCEC) Foundation Scholarship. With this life-changing award, Sofia is now able to pursue her passion for engineering at Harvey Mudd College.

"There is less stress about the financial burden of going to college, which has always been a concern for me," Sofia shared. Her journey to this point was shaped by her participation in the FIRST® Tech Challenge (FTC) Robotics program, an after-school robotics program funded by the Foundation.

"Robotics gave me the confidence to say I'm capable of succeeding in STEM," she added, highlighting the pivotal role of CEF-funded programs in her academic and personal growth.




